The 6-foot, 175-pound senior shortstop had led the Cougars to a 31-3 record and a berth in the Region 2 Tournament at the time of his selection. Witt owned a .510 batting average with 31 RBI, 51 runs scored and a .586 on-base percentage through 34 games. A First Team All-State selection, he was also named to the USA TODAY's American Family Insurance ALL-USA West Virginia Second Team.

Witt has maintained a 3.19 GPA in the classroom. A devoted member of his church community, he has volunteered locally on behalf of youth baseball programs.

"Witt is one of the most polished high school baseball players I've seen," said Dirk Webb, Hedgesville High head coach. "He's consistent and far above average offensively. He has some of the best technique, softest hands and overall baseball IQ that I've seen at the high school level."

Witt has signed a National Letter of Intent to play baseball on scholarship at Virginia Commonwealth University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
