CURRY HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® ALABAMA SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-8 senior right-handed pitcher led the Yellow Jackets (47-2) to the Class 4A state championship this past season. Swindle compiled a 45-2 record and a 0.59 ERA in the circle, along with a .557 batting average, 13 home runs and 86 RBI at the plate. A member of USA TODAY's American Family Insurance Preseason ALL-USA Softball Team, she was the Class 4A Player of the Year and a Super All-State Team honoree as a junior.

Swindle has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom. A devoted member of her church youth group, she has volunteered locally on behalf of an animal shelter in addition to participating in food, clothing and toy drives to benefit the needy.

"Ashlee Swindle is outstanding," said Karen Johns, head coach at Hewitt-Trussville High. "I think she's the best high school pitcher in Alabama, and she's likely one of the top ten hitters too."

Swindle has signed a National Letter of Intent to play softball on scholarship at Auburn University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
