## EAST ANCHORAGE HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® ALASKA SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 2, 2016) — In its 31st year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Daisy Page of East Anchorage High School as its 2015-16 Gatorade Alaska Softball Player of the Year. The 5-foot-8 sophomore right-handed pitcher has led the Thunderbirds to a 23-3 record and a berth in the state tournament, scheduled to begin June 4. A First Team All-Cook Inlet Conference selection, Page compiled a 23-3 record in the circle through 26 games with a 1.41 ERA and 193 strikeouts in 124 innings pitched. Offensively, she batted .581 with three home runs, 30 runs scored and a 1.041 slugging percentage.

Page has maintained a 3.83 weighted GPA in the classroom. A devoted parishioner in her church community, she has participated locally on behalf of multiple car wash fundraisers and as a youth softball coach.

"In my opinion, Daisy Page is by far the best pitcher we have here in the state of Alaska and she is still just a sophomore," said East Anchorage head coach Paul Schoenborn. "She has pitched every inning for us since she has been at our school. This team is only going to go as far as she takes us."

Page will begin her junior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
