## CHAPEL HILL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® GEORGIA SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 2, 2016) — In its 31st year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Ashley Morgan of Chapel Hill High School as its 2015-16 Gatorade Georgia Softball Player of the Year. The 5-foot-6 junior left-handed pitcher led the Panthers (32-3) to the Class 5A state championship this past season. Morgan compiled a 19-1 record with a 0.81 ERA in the circle and slugged her way to a .505 batting average, 11 home runs and 43 RBI at the plate. The Class 5A Player of the Year, she is also a two-time First Team All-State selection and a three-time County Player of the Year.

Morgan has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally on behalf of community improvement initiatives and blood-donation drives.

"Morgan throws hard and does a great job of sequencing and changing up her pitches," said Stacy Parker, head coach at Dalton High. "She's also a pure power hitter, but she can hit it to all fields. She's just a really good player overall."

Morgan will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
