NESHOBA CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MISSISSIPPI SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 2, 2016) — In its 31st year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Aspen Wesley of Neshoba Central High School as its 2015-16 Gatorade Mississippi Softball Player of the Year. The 5-foot-4 freshman right-handed pitcher led the Rockets to a 27-1 record and a fourth consecutive Class 5A state championship this past season. Wesley did not allow an earned run in eight Class 5A state tournament games, including a pair of shutouts in a two-game finals' sweep of West Harrison. A three-time Clarion-Ledger First Team All-State selection, Wesley finished with a 24-1 record, posting a 0.23 ERA and amassing 294 strikeouts in 155 innings pitched. She also batted .338 with five extra-base hits and 17 RBI.

Wesley has maintained a B average in the classroom. A member of her school's Spanish and Bible clubs, she has also volunteered on behalf of her church and as a youth softball instructor.

"Aspen is a very dedicated and hardworking student-athlete," said Neshoba Central head coach Trae Embry. "She believes in hard work and especially works hard at her pitching. She is a very special talent that loves to compete and loves her teammates."

Wesley will begin her sophomore year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
