## PARK HILL SOUTH HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MISSOURI SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Kinsey posted a 17-3 record with a 1.03 ERA in the circle and batted .429 with six home runs and 28 RBI. The Kansas City Star All-Metro Player of the Year, she also struck out 236 batters in 122.1 innings. Kinsey is a First Team All-State selection and is ranked as the nation's No. 35 recruit in the Class of 2017 by FloSoftball.com.

Kinsey has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally on behalf of youth softball programs.

"Olivia Kinsey is the toughest pitcher we've faced for the past two seasons," said Jairus Tapp, head coach at Staley High. "She's a phenomenal player. I've been really impressed with her raw talent and her competitiveness. She's just a bulldog."

Kinsey will begin her senior year of high school this fall.
