## W.T. CLARKE HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NEW YORK SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 2, 2016) — In its 31st year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Sarah Cornell of W.T. Clarke High School as its 2015-16 Gatorade New York Softball Player of the Year. Cornell is the first Gatorade New York Softball Player of the Year to be chosen from W.T. Clarke High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the field, distinguishes Cornell as New York's best high school softball player. The 5-foot-8 senior right-handed pitcher had led the Rams to a 16-3 record and a berth in the Class A state quarterfinals at the time of her selection. Cornell owned a 16-3 record and a 0.50 ERA in the circle entering the state playoffs, along with a .500 batting average, six home runs and 26 RBI. The Long Island Player of the Year and a First Team All-State honoree, she had struck out 228 batters in 125 innings pitched, surrendering just 52 hits and 33 walks.

Cornell has maintained B average in the classroom. She has raised money to benefit breast cancer awareness and has volunteered locally on behalf of youth sports programs as well as her school's Athletic Booster Club.

"She's a special pitcher," said Anthony Turco, head coach at Carey High. "She's a Nolan Ryan-type player: power and dominance. She understands the game, she has confidence in her stuff and she can hit too."

Cornell has signed a National Letter of Intent to play softball on scholarship at Hofstra University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
