## ESSEX HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® VERMONT SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-6 senior right-handed pitcher had led the Hornets to a 16-0 record and the top seed in the Division 1 state tournament at the time of her selection. Rutz owned a 16-0 record and a 0.65 ERA in the circle entering the postseason, along with a .441 batting average, six home runs and 31 RBI. A three-time First Team All-Metro selection, she has struck out 160 batters in 97 innings pitched while issuing just seven walks.

Rutz has maintained an A average in the classroom. A member of her school's Athletic Leadership Council, she has volunteered locally on behalf of the American Red Cross, Ronald McDonald House Charities and youth softball clinics.

"Rutz has had a great year and a wonderful career," said Jay Hartman, head coach at Missisquoi Valley Union High.
"The numbers speak for themselves on the mound and she's one of the most dangerous hitters in the state. If you make a mistake, she'll make you pay."

Rutz will attend Bowdoin College this fall, where she will play softball.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
