FALMOUTH HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE MAINE GIRLS TRACK & FIELD ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 23, 2016) — In its 31st year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Adelaide Cooke of Falmouth High School as its 2015-16 Gatorade Maine Girls Track & Field Athlete of the Year. The 5-foot-9 junior won the shot put and the discus at the Class A state meet this past season, leading the Yachtsmen to the state championship as a team. Cooke hurled the shot put 39 feet, 11.5 inches and launched the discus 131-0, while also finishing second in the javelin and fourth in the 100-meter high hurdles. She earned a second-place finish in the discus at the New England Championships.

Cooke has maintained an A average in the classroom. She has volunteered locally on behalf of Maine Medical Center and youth sports programs.

"Adelaide has impressed from the moment she arrived at her first high school practice," said Falmouth coach Danny Paul. "She enjoys working and she loves a challenge. Her positive attitude is contagious."

Cooke will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
