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**DEKALB HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED
GATORADE INDIANA GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY RUNNER OF THE YEAR**

CHICAGO (January 23, 2017) — In its 32nd year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, today announced Tyler Schwartz of DeKalb High School as its 2016-17 Gatorade Indiana Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year. Schwartz is the first Gatorade Indiana Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year to be chosen from DeKalb High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the racecourse, distinguishes Schwartz as Indiana's best high school girls cross country runner. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Girls Cross Country Runner of the Year award to be announced in January/February, Schwartz joins an elite alumni association of past state award-winners in 12 sports, including Lukas Verzbicas (2010-11, 2009-10 Carl Sandburg, Orland Park, Ill.), Megan Goethals (2009-10, Rochester, Rochester Hills, Mich.), Jordan Hasay (2008-09, Mission College Prep., San Luis Obispo, Calif.) and Chris Derrick (2007-08, Neuqua Valley, Naperville, Ill.).

The 5-foot junior raced to the individual state championship this past season with a time of 18:08.6. Schwartz also earned victories at the Baron Classic, the Flashrock Invitational and the New Haven Invitational, as well as the Sectional, Regional and Semi-state championships. She finished fifth at the Nike Cross Nationals Midwest Regional championships and was 31st nationally at the NXN Final.

Schwartz has volunteered locally on behalf of youth running programs. "Tyler is the definition of hard work that our program strives for," said DeKalb coach Wade Buchs. "There's no quit in her, and that is ultimately what makes her so successful."

Schwartz has maintained a B average in the classroom. She will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The [Gatorade Player of the Year](#) program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Schwartz joins Gatorade Indiana Girls Cross Country Runners of the Year Sarah Leinheiser (2015-16, Carmel High School), Anna Rohrer (2014-15 & 2012-13, Mishawaka High School), Kelcy Welch (2013-14, Carmel High School), Ashley Erba (2011-12, Warsaw Community High School), Waverly Neer (2010-11 & 2009-10, Culver Academies), Sarah Higgins (2008-09, Center Grove High School), and Alex Banfich (2007-08, Culver Academies) as athletes who have won the cross country award since its inception in 2007.

As a Gatorade Player of the Year, Schwartz will be able to select a national or local youth sports organization to receive a grant as part of the Gatorade Play It Forward program. Every Gatorade Player of the Year state winner receives a \$1,000 grant to donate and will have the opportunity to enter for an additional \$10,000 spotlight grant by writing a brief essay explaining why their selected organization deserves additional support. 12 spotlight grants - one for each sport - will be announced throughout the year.
