REED HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED GATORADE NEVADA BOYS CROSS COUNTRY RUNNER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (January 30, 2017) — In its 32nd year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, today announced Anthony Ocegueda of Reed High School as its 2016-17 Gatorade Nevada Boys Cross Country Runner of the Year. Ocegueda is the first Gatorade Nevada Boys Cross Country Runner of the Year to be chosen from Reed High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the racecourse, distinguishes Ocegueda as Nevada's best high school boys cross country runner. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Boys Cross Country Runner of the Year award to be announced in January, Ocegueda joins an elite alumni association of past state award-winners in 12 sports, including Lukas Verzbicas (2010-11, 2009-10 Carl Sandburg, Orland Park, Ill.), Megan Goethals (2009-10, Rochester, Rochester Hills, Mich.), Jordan Hasay (2008-09, Mission College Prep., San Luis Obispo, Calif.), Donn Cabral (2007-08, Glastonbury High School, Glastonbury, Conn.) and Chris Derrick (2007-08, Neuqua Valley, Naperville, Ill.).

The 5-foot-9, 130-pound senior raced to the Class 4A individual state championship this past season with a time of 15:12. Ocegueda also won the Twilight Classic, the Hoka One One Bronco Invitational, the Reed Invitational and the Douglas Class Races, while placing 30th at the Foot Locker West Regional championships.

Ocegueda has volunteered locally on behalf of the Food Bank of Northern Nevada, the Children's Miracle Network and youth sports programs. "Anthony had an amazing senior season," said Reed coach Lisa Stevens. "He demonstrates great natural talent, but he doesn't coast on that talent. He embodies the definition of grit, and shows amazing perseverance when it comes to his training, running and racing."

Ocegueda has maintained a 3.34 GPA in the classroom. He remains undecided upon a collegiate destination.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Ocegueda joins Gatorade Nevada Boys Cross Country Runners of the Year Chase Wood (2015-16, Faith Lutheran High School), DaJour Braxton (2014-15, Centennial High School), Kai Benedict (2013-14, McQueen High School), Jordan Cardenas (2012-13, Reno High School), Nick Hartle (2011-12 & 2010-11, Centennial High School), Wade Meddles (2009-10 & 2008-09, Sierra Lutheran High School), and Bryan Tibaduiza (2007-08, Galena High School) as athletes who have won the cross country award since its inception in 2007.

As a Gatorade Player of the Year, Ocegueda will be able to select a national or local youth sports organization to receive a grant as part of the Gatorade Play It Forward program. Every Gatorade Player of the Year state winner receives a \$1,000 grant to donate and will have the opportunity to enter for an additional \$10,000 spotlight grant by writing a brief essay explaining why their selected organization deserves additional support. 12 spotlight grants – one for each sport – will be announced throughout the year.
