**WEST CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED
GATORADE SOUTH DAKOTA BOYS CROSS COUNTRY RUNNER OF THE YEAR**

CHICAGO (January 30, 2017) — In its 32nd year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, today announced Derick Peters of West Central High School as its 2016-17 Gatorade South Dakota Boys Cross Country Runner of the Year. Peters is the first Gatorade South Dakota Boys Cross Country Runner of the Year to be chosen from West Central High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the racecourse, distinguishes Peters as South Dakota's best high school boys cross country runner. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Boys Cross Country Runner of the Year award to be announced in January, Peters joins an elite alumni association of past state award-winners in 12 sports, including Lukas Verzbicas (2010-11, 2009-10 Carl Sandburg, Orland Park, Ill.), Megan Goethals (2009-10, Rochester, Rochester Hills, Mich.), Jordan Hasay (2008-09, Mission College Prep., San Luis Obispo, Calif.), Donn Cabral (2007-08, Glastonbury High School, Glastonbury, Conn.) and Chris Derrick (2007-08, Neuqua Valley, Naperville, Ill.).

The 5-foot-11, 155-pound junior won the Class A state meet this past season with a time of 15:37.67, breaking the tape 55.09 seconds ahead of his next-closest competitor and leading the Trojans to a second-place finish as a team. Peters finished 31st at the Nike Cross Nationals Heartland Regional championships and placed 32nd at the Foot Locker Midwest Regional championships. He was undefeated against in-state competition and recorded the fastest prep time of the year with his first-place finish at the Lennox Invitational in 14:57.18.

A drum major for the West Central Marching Band and a trombone player in the West Central Concert and Jazz bands, Peters has volunteered locally as a youth soccer referee. "Even though we had a very talented team this year, every time we raced against Derick Peters, he was the one who stole the show," said Luke Vander Leest, head coach of Sioux Falls Christian High. "We expected him to be one of the top runners in our conference, but he far exceeded the expectations that many of us had."

Peters has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom and ranks No. 1 in his class. He will begin his senior year of high school this fall.

The [Gatorade Player of the Year](#) program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Peters joins Gatorade South Dakota Boys Cross Country Runners of the Year Gabe Peters (2015-16, Lincoln High School), Will Lauer (2014-15, Lincoln High School), Addison DeHaven (2013-14 & 2012-13, Brookings High School), Tony Smoragiewicz (2011-12 & 2010-11, Rapid City Central High School), Josh Heitkamp (2009-10, Washington High School), Alex Muntefering (2008-09, Parkston High School), and Bill Kogel (2007-08, Roosevelt High School) as athletes who have won the cross country award since its inception in 2007.

As a Gatorade Player of the Year, Peters will be able to select a national or local youth sports organization to receive a grant as part of the Gatorade Play It Forward program. Every Gatorade Player of the Year state winner receives a \$1,000 grant to donate and will have the opportunity to enter for an additional \$10,000 spotlight grant by writing a brief essay explaining why their selected organization deserves additional support. 12 spotlight grants - one for each sport - will be announced throughout the year.
