**DIMOND HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED
GATORADE ALASKA GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR**

CHICAGO (June 19, 2017) — In its 32nd year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, today announced Kelsey Eagle of Dimond High School as its 2016-17 Gatorade Alaska Girls Soccer Player of the Year. Eagle is the third Gatorade Alaska Girls Soccer Player of the Year to be chosen from Dimond High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the field, distinguishes Eagle as Alaska's best high school girls soccer player. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Girls Soccer Player of the Year award to be announced in June, Eagle joins an elite alumni association of past state soccer award-winners, including Alexi Lalas (1987-88, Cranbrook HS, Mich.), Steve Cherundolo (1996-97, Mt. Carmel HS, Calif.), Abby Wambach (1997-98, Our Lady of Mercy, N.Y.), Heather O'Reilly (2001-02, 2002-03, East Brunswick HS, N.J.), Matt Besler (2004-04, Blue Valley West HS, Kans.), Jack Harrison (2013-14, Berkshire HS, Mass.), Mallory Pugh (2014-15, Mountain Vista HS, Colo.).

The 5-foot-2 senior midfielder scored 12 goals and passed for 8 assists this past season, leading the Lynx (19-0-1) to their second consecutive state championship. A four-time All-Cook Inlet Conference selection, Eagle was also named to the All-State Tournament team.

Eagle has volunteered locally on behalf of an animal shelter and youth soccer programs. "Kelsey Eagle is a complete player," said Ula Rowe, head coach at Bartlett High School. "She uses both feet, she can play multiple positions and she plays all of them very well. She has a great work rate and she's a great competitor too."

Eagle has maintained a weighted 4.05 GPA in the classroom. She has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on scholarship at Seattle University this fall.

The [Gatorade Player of the Year](#) program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Eagle joins recent Gatorade Alaska Girls Soccer Players of the Year Malia Lyken (2015-16, Dimond High School), Haleigh Van Allen (2014-15, Service High School), Holly Brehmer (2013-14, Chugiak High School), Aaliyah Lewis (2012-13 & 2011-12, Dimond High School), Kelly Cobb (2010-11, Chugiak High School), Tricia Stonebraker (2009-10, Service High School), Alev Kelter (2008-09 & 2007-08, Chugiak High School), and Carly Butcher (2006-07, South Anchorage High School) among the state's list of former award winners.

As a Gatorade Player of the Year, Kelsey will be able to select a national or local youth sports organization to receive a grant as part of the Gatorade Play It Forward program. Every Gatorade Player of the Year state winner receives a \$1,000 grant to donate and will have the opportunity to enter for an additional \$10,000 spotlight grant by writing a brief essay explaining why their selected organization deserves additional support. 12 spotlight grants - one for each sport - will be announced throughout the year.
