**SKYVIEW HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED
GATORADE IDAHO VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR**

CHICAGO (January 16, 2018) — In its 33rd year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, today announced Dani Nay of Skyview High School as its 2017-18 Gatorade Idaho Volleyball Player of the Year. Nay is the first Gatorade Idaho Volleyball Player of the Year to be chosen from Skyview High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the field, distinguishes Nay as Idaho's best high school volleyball player. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Volleyball Player of the Year award to be announced in January, Nay joins an elite alumni association of state award-winners in 12 sports, including USA Volleyball players Kayla Banwarth (2006-07, Wahlert HS, Iowa), Alisha Glass (2005-06, Leland Public HS, Mich.), Jordan Larson (2004-05, Logan View HS, Neb.) and Foluke Akinradewo (2004-05, St. Thomas HS, Fla.).

The 5-foot-11 senior outside hitter led the Hawks to a 40-3 record and their second consecutive Class 4A state championship this past season. The state's returning Gatorade Volleyball Player of the Year, Nay amassed 488 kills, 289 digs, 52 service aces and 49 blocks. The two-time Southern Idaho Conference Player of the Year, she is also a three-time First Team All-State selection.

A devoted member of her church community, Nay has volunteered locally on behalf of the Salvation Army and a homeless shelter. "Nay is incredibly fluid in the way she plays the game," said Collin Hartman, head coach at Eagle High. "She sees the court extremely well and she has a wide range of shots in her arsenal. She's very competitive and fiery, and she's the type of athlete who wants the ball on match point."

Nay has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom. She has signed a National Letter of Intent to play volleyball on scholarship at Weber State University this fall.

The [Gatorade Player of the Year](#) program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Two-time winner Nay joins Gatorade Idaho Volleyball Players of the Year Maya Taylor (2015-16, Idaho Falls High School), Kayla Ellis (2014-15 & 2013-14, Century High School), Sadie Stutzman (2012-13, Fruitland High School), Jenna Ellis (2011-12, Century High School), Megan Sorenson (2010-11, Rocky Mountain High School), Morgan Odale (2009-10 & 2008-09, Eagle High School), and Brittany Hewitt (2007-08, Eagle High School) among the state's list of former award winners.

As a Gatorade Player of the Year, Nay will be able to select a national or local youth sports organization to receive a grant as part of the Gatorade Play It Forward program. Every Gatorade Player of the Year state winner receives a \$1,000 grant to donate and will have the opportunity to enter for an additional \$10,000 spotlight grant by writing a brief essay explaining why their selected organization deserves additional support. 12 spotlight grants - one for each sport - will be announced throughout the year.
