CARAVEL ACADEMY STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED GATORADE® DELAWARE SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-6 junior catcher and first baseman led the Buccaneers (16-4) to the state semifinals this past season. Marcon produced a .520 batting average with eight home runs, 25 RBI and a slugging percentage of 1.140. A four-year varsity starter, she is a First Team All-State honoree.

Marcon has volunteered locally on behalf of the Horsey Family Youth Foundation, the Special Olympics and youth softball clinics.

Marcon has maintained a 3.96 GPA in the classroom. She will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

As a Gatorade Player of the Year, Nicole will be able to select a national or local youth sports organization to receive a grant as part of the Gatorade Play It Forward program. Every Gatorade Player of the Year state winner receives a \$1,000 grant to donate and will have the opportunity to enter for an additional \$10,000 spotlight grant by writing a brief essay explaining why their selected organization deserves additional support. 12 spotlight grants – one for each sport – will be announced throughout the year.
