**PAPILLION-LA VISTA HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED  
GATORADE® NEBRASKA SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR**

CHICAGO (June 4, 2018) — In its 33<sup>rd</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, today announced Courtney Wallace of Papillion-La Vista High School as its 2017-18 Gatorade Nebraska Softball Player of the Year. Wallace is the fifth Gatorade Nebraska Softball Player of the Year to be chosen from Papillion-La Vista High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the field, distinguishes Wallace as Nebraska's best high school softball player. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Softball Player of the Year award announced in June, Wallace joins an elite alumni association of past state softball award-winners, including Catherine Osterman (2000-01, Cy Spring High School, Texas), Kelsey Stewart (2009-10, Arkansas City High School, Kan.), Carley Hoover (2012-13 D.W. Daniel High School, S.C.), Jenna Lilley (2012-13, Hoover High School, Ohio), Morgan Zerkle (2012-13 Cabell Midland High School, W. Va.), and Rachel Garcia (2014-15, Highland High School, Calif.).

The 5-foot-6 senior right-handed pitcher and third baseman led the Monarchs (36-2) to the Class A state championship this past season. Wallace compiled an 18-1 record with a 0.28 ERA in the circle to go with a .513 batting average, nine home runs and 35 RBI. A three-time First Team All-State selection, she was named honorary captain of both the Omaha World-Herald All-Nebraska team and the Lincoln Journal Star Super-State team.

Wallace has volunteered locally on behalf of a food bank, the U.S. Marine Corps Toys for Tots program, Open Door Mission and the Susan G. Komen Race for the Cure.

Wallace has maintained a 3.31 GPA in the classroom. She has signed a National Letter of Intent to play softball on scholarship at the University of Nebraska this fall.

The [Gatorade Player of the Year](#) program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Wallace joins recent Gatorade Nebraska Softball Players of the Year Rylie Unzicker (2016-17, Millard South High School), Samantha Dellinger (2015-16, Papillion-La Vista High School), Erin Lockhart (2014-15, Lincoln Southeast High School), Kaylan Jablonski (2013-14, Skutt Catholic High School), Madi Unzicker (2012-13, Millard South High School), Alicia Armstrong (2011-12, Beatrice High School), Allie Mathewson (2010-11, Papillion-La Vista South High School), Becca Changstrom (2009-10 & 2008-09, Lincoln Southwest High School), Ashley Hagemann (2007-08, Elkhorn High School), and Ashley Hagemann (2006-07, Elkhorn High School) among the state's list of former award winners.

As a Gatorade Player of the Year, Courtney will be able to select a national or local youth sports organization to receive a grant as part of the Gatorade Play It Forward program. Every Gatorade Player of the Year state winner receives a \$1,000 grant to donate and will have the opportunity to enter for an additional \$10,000 spotlight grant by writing a brief essay explaining why their selected organization deserves additional support. 12 spotlight grants - one for each sport - will be announced throughout the year.
