## BISHOP MCNAMARA HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED GATORADE MARYLAND GIRLS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

**CHICAGO** (March 8, 2019) — In its 34<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, today announced **Jakia Brown-Turner of Bishop McNamara High School** as its **2018-19 Gatorade Maryland Girls Basketball Player of the Year**. Brown-Turner is the fourth Gatorade Maryland Girls Basketball Player of the Year to be chosen from Bishop McNamara High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the field, distinguishes Brown-Turner as Maryland's best high school girls basketball player. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Girls Basketball Player of the Year award to be announced in March, Brown-Turner joins an elite alumni association of state award-winners in 12 sports, including Maya Moore (2005-06, Collins Hill High School, Ga.), Rashanda McCants (2004-05, Asheville High School, N.C.), Candace Parker (2001-02, 2002-03 & 2003-04, Naperville Central High School, Ill.), Diana Taurasi (1998-99 & 1999-00, Don Antonio Lugo High School, Calif.), Shyra Ely (1999-00, Ben Davis High School, Ind.), Katie Smith (1991-92, Logan High School, Ohio) and Lisa Leslie (1988-89, Morningside High School, Calif.).

The 6-foot senior wing averaged 16.0 points, 7.3 rebounds, 2.1 steals and 1.6 assists per game this past season, leading the Mustangs (31-4) to the Washington Catholic Athletic Conference Tournament championship game. A McDonald's All-American Game selection, Brown-Turner is a three-time WCAC First Team All-League honoree. She concluded her prep basketball career with a school-record 1,886 points.

Brown-Turner has volunteered locally at a care center for seniors with special needs, and has also donated her time to multiple community service initiatives through Bishop McNamara's Holy Cross Service Program. "Jakia is the best player in Maryland, hands down," said Scott Allen, head coach of Paul VI Catholic High. "She can shoot it, has good size and handles the ball well. She is talented."

Brown-Turner has maintained a 3.33 GPA in the classroom and represents one of the state's top academic candidates in meeting the Gatorade award's broad criteria. She has signed a national letter of intent to play basketball on scholarship at North Carolina State University beginning this fall.

The <u>Gatorade Player of the Year</u> program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. From the 12 national winners, one male and one female athlete are each named Gatorade High School Athlete of the Year. In all, 607 athletes are honored each year.

Brown-Turner joins Gatorade Maryland Girls Basketball Players of the Year Nia Clouden (2017-18 & 2016-17, St. Frances Academy), Mykea Gray (2015-16, National Christian Academy), Taylor Murray (2014-15, Annapolis Area Christian School), and De'Janae Boykin (2013-14, C.H. Flowers High School) as athletes who have won the basketball award.

As a part of Gatorade's cause marketing platform "Play it Forward," Brown-Turner also has the opportunity to award a \$1,000 grant to a local or national youth sports organization of her choosing. She is also eligible to submit an essay to win one of twelve \$10,000 spotlight grants for the organization of choice, which will be announced throughout the year.

Since the program's inception in 1985, Gatorade Player of the Year award recipients have won hundreds of professional and college championships, and many have also turned into pillars in their communities, becoming coaches, business owners and educators.
