WALNUT RIDGE HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED GATORADE® OHIO BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (March 26, 2020) — In its 35th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, today announced **VonCameron Davis of Walnut Ridge High School** as its **2019-20 Gatorade Ohio Boys Basketball Player of the Year**. Davis is the first Gatorade Ohio Boys Basketball Player of the Year to be chosen from Walnut Ridge High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the field, distinguishes Davis as Ohio's best high school boys basketball player. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Boys Basketball Player of the Year award, Davis joins an elite alumni association of past state boys basketball award winners, including Karl-Anthony Towns (2012-13 & 2013-14, St. Joseph High School, N.J.), Dwight Howard (2003-04, Southwest Atlanta Christian Academy, Ga.), Chris Bosh (2001-02, Lincoln High School, Texas), Paul Pierce (1994-95, Inglewood High School, Calif.), Chauncey Billups (1993-94 & 1994-95, George Washington High School, Colo.) and Jason Kidd (1991-92, St. Joseph Notre Dame High School, Calif.).

The 6-foot-5, 210-pound senior forward led the Scots to a 22-4 record and the Division 1 regional semifinals at the time of his selection. Davis averaged 27.1 points, 11.0 rebounds and 2.4 steals through 26 games. The Central Ohio Player of the Year, he is a four-time All-City honoree and was named to the All-Ohio First Team.

A devoted member of his church community, Davis has volunteered locally on behalf of youth basketball programs. "VonCameron Davis is an exceptional player," said Quintin Aden, head coach at Independence High. "He's dominant in the paint, but he can score it at all three levels. His strength and his physicality really set him apart."

Davis has maintained a B average in the classroom. He has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at Kent State University this fall.

Davis joins Gatorade Ohio Boys Basketball Players of the Year Ben Roderick (2018-19, Olentangy Liberty High School), Dane Goodwin (2017-18, Upper Arlington High School), Kaleb Wesson (2016-17, Westerville South High School), Xavier Simpson (2015-16, Lima Senior High School), and Luke Kennard (2014-15, Franklin High School) among the state's list of former award winners.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

The 2019-2020 Gatorade National Boys Basketball Player of the Year announcement has been temporarily postponed due to the Coronavirus pandemic. To ensure the safety of everyone involved, The Gatorade Company will follow the guidance of experts and health officials as it determines the appropriate time to announce this year's winner.

As a part of Gatorade's cause marketing platform "Play it Forward," Davis also has the opportunity to award a \$1,000 grant to a local or national youth sports organization of his choosing. He is also eligible to submit an essay to win one of twelve \$10,000 spotlight grants for the organization of choice, which will be announced throughout the year.

Since the program's inception in 1985, Gatorade Player of the Year award recipients have won hundreds of professional and college championships, and many have also turned into pillars in their communities, becoming coaches, business owners and educators.
