WOODDALE HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED GATORADE® TENNESSEE BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (March 26, 2020) — In its 35th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, today announced **Johnathan Lawson of Wooddale High School** as its **2019-20 Gatorade Tennessee Boys Basketball Player of the Year**. Lawson is the first Gatorade Tennessee Boys Basketball Player of the Year to be chosen from Wooddale High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the field, distinguishes Lawson as Tennessee's best high school boys basketball player. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Boys Basketball Player of the Year award, Lawson joins an elite alumni association of past state boys basketball award winners, including Karl-Anthony Towns (2012-13 & 2013-14, St. Joseph High School, N.J.), Dwight Howard (2003-04, Southwest Atlanta Christian Academy, Ga.), Chris Bosh (2001-02, Lincoln High School, Texas), Paul Pierce (1994-95, Inglewood High School, Calif.), Chauncey Billups (1993-94 & 1994-95, George Washington High School, Colo.) and Jason Kidd (1991-92, St. Joseph Notre Dame High School, Calif.).

The 6-foot-7, 180-pound junior forward led the Cardinals to a 27-6 record and a berth in a Class AA state tournament quarterfinals at the time of his selection. Lawson averaged 25.4 points, 11.7 rebounds, 6.0 assists, 2.0 steals and 2.0 blocks through 33 games as Wooddale pursued its second straight state title. A two-time member of the Region 8-AA All-Tournament Team, he is ranked as the nation's No. 42 recruit in the Class of 2021 by ESPN.com.

An avid chess player, Lawson has volunteered locally as a peer tutor and as part of elementary school literacy programs. "Johnathan is long, has handle and he's very skilled," said J'malo White, head coach of Craigmont High. "Wooddale would be a normal team without him."

Lawson has maintained an A average in the classroom. He will begin his senior year of high school this fall.

Lawson joins Gatorade Tennessee Boys Basketball Players of the Year James Wiseman (2018-19, Memphis East High School), Darius Garland (2017-18, Brentwood Academy), Tyler Harris (2016-17, Cordova High School), Alex Lomax (2015-16, Memphis East High School), and Dedric Lawson (2014-15, Hamilton High School) among the state's list of former award winners.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

The 2019-2020 Gatorade National Boys Basketball Player of the Year announcement has been temporarily postponed due to the Coronavirus pandemic. To ensure the safety of everyone involved, The Gatorade Company will follow the guidance of experts and health officials as it determines the appropriate time to announce this year's winner.

As a part of Gatorade's cause marketing platform "Play it Forward," Lawson also has the opportunity to award a \$1,000 grant to a local or national youth sports organization of his choosing. He is also eligible to submit an essay to win one of twelve \$10,000 spotlight grants for the organization of choice, which will be announced throughout the year.

Since the program's inception in 1985, Gatorade Player of the Year award recipients have won hundreds of professional and college championships, and many have also turned into pillars in their communities, becoming coaches, business owners and educators.
