BENTONVILLE WEST HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED GATORADE ARKANSAS SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (May 28, 2020) — In its 35th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company today announced Hallie Wacaser of Bentonville West High School as its 2019-20 Gatorade Arkansas Softball Player of the Year. Wacaser is the second Gatorade Arkansas Softball Player of the Year to be chosen from Bentonville West High School.

The 2017-18 Gatorade Player of the Year, the 5-foot-4 senior shortstop was named the best player in the state by MaxPreps.com during the 2020 preseason. A member of the USA Softball 17-and-under Women's National Team, Wacaser won a gold medal with Team USA at the Pan Am Games this past October. A three-time First Team All-State selection, Wacaser is ranked as the nation's No. 18 recruit in the Class of 2020 by FloSoftball.com. She concluded her prep softball career with a .496 batting average, 141 hits, 137 runs scored, 129 runs batted in and 36 home runs.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track and field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. From the 12 national winners, one male and one female athlete are each named Gatorade High School Athlete of the Year. In all, 607 athletes are honored each year.

Two -time winner Wacaser joins Gatorade Arkansas Softball Players of the Year Joley Mitchell (2018-19, Rose Bud High School), Maddy Prough (2016-17, Bentonville High School), and Autumn Humes (2015-16 & 2014-15, Bald Knob High School) among the state's list of former award winners.

Since the program's inception in 1985, Gatorade Player of the Year award recipients have won hundreds of professional and college championships, and many have also turned into pillars in their communities, becoming coaches, business owners and educators.
