ST. DOMINIC HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED GAT OR ADE MISSOURI GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 17, 2020) — In its 35th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company today announced Grace Bindbeutel of St. Dominic High School as its 2019-20 Gatorade Missouri Girls Soccer Player of the Year. The 5-foot-4 sophomore forward was one of the leading scorers for the Under-16 St. Louis Scott Gallagher club team in the U.S. Soccer Development Academy. The 2019 St. Louis Post Dispatch All-Metro Co-Player of the Year, Bindbeutel scored 30 goals and passed for 16 assists as a freshman to lead the Crusaders to the Class 3 state championship. Also a 2019 United Soccer Coaches High School All-American selection, Bindbeutel is ranked as the nation's No. 123 recruit in the Class of 2022 by TopDrawerSoccer.com.

Bindbeutel has volunteered locally at a food bank and homeless shelter in addition to donating her time as a youth soccer coach. "Grace Bindbeutel is one of the brightest talents in Missouri high school soccer right now," said Greg Koeller, head coach of St. Dominic High. "She is difficult to dispossess and her finishing is top-notch."

Bindbeutel has maintained a 3.79 GPA in the classroom. She will begin her junior year of high school this fall.

The <u>Gatorade Player of the Year</u> program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls bask etball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
