## MINOT HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED GATORADE NORTH DAKOTA GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 15, 2021) — In its 36<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, Gatorade today announced MaLiah Burke of Minot High School as its 2020-21 Gatorade North Dakota Girls Soccer Player of the Year. Burke is the third Gatorade North Dakota Girls Soccer Player of the Year to be chosen from Minot High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the field, distinguishes Burke as North Dakota's best high school girls soccer player. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Girls Soccer Player of the Year award to be announced in June, Burke joins an elite alumni association of state award-winners in 12 sports, including Alexi Lalas (1987-88, Cranbrook High School, Mich.), Steve Cherundolo (1996-97, Mt. Carmel High School, Calif.), Abby Wambach (1997-98, Our Lady of Mercy School of Young Women, N.Y.), Heather O'Reilly (2001-02 & 2002-03, East Brunswick High School, N.J.), Matt Besler (2004-05, Blue Valley West High School, Kans.), Jack Harrison (2013-14, Berkshire High School, Mass.) and Mallory Pugh (2014-15, Mountain Vista High School, Colo.).

The 5-foot-7 junior midfielder and forward scored 23 goals and passed for 17 assists this past season, leading the Majettes (16-0) to the first championship in program history. Burke is a First Team All-State honoree and a three-time All-Western Dakota Association selection.

Also a track standout, Burke is a member of her school's Student Council and has volunteered locally on behalf of the Humane Society and youth sports programs. "MaLiah Burke is an extremely strong player," said Brandi Harty, head coach at Jamestown High. "She's smart and very fast, and she's creative on the ball."

Burke has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom. She will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The <u>Gatorade Player of the Year</u> program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which works with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Burke joins recent Gatorade North Dakota Girls Soccer Players of the Year Elle Hill (2019-20, Bismarck High School), Allison Lepp (2018-19 & 2017-18, Minot High School), and Sofia Lewis (2016-17, Minot High School), among the state's list of former award winners.

Through Gatorade's cause marketing platform "Play it Forward," Burke has the opportunity to award a \$1,000 grant to a local or national youth sports organization of their choosing. Burke is also eligible to submit a 30-second video explaining why the organization they chose is deserving of one of twelve \$10,000 spotlight grants, which will be announced throughout the year. To date, Gatorade Player of the Year winners' grants have totaled more than \$2.7 million across 1,117 organizations.

Since the program's inception in 1985, Gatorade Player of the Year award recipients have won hundreds of professional and college championships, and many have also turned into pillars in their communities, becoming coaches, business owners and educators.
