LATIN SCHOOL OF CHICAGO STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED GATORADE ILLINOIS GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (January 24, 2022) — In its 37th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, Gatorade today announced **Ava Parekh of Latin School of Chicago** is the **2021-22 Gatorade Illinois Girls Cross Country Player of the Year**. Parekh is the first Gatorade Illinois Girls Cross Country Player of the Year to be chosen from Latin School of Chicago.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the field, distinguishes Parekh as Illinois' best high school girls cross country player. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Girls Cross Country Player of the Year award to be announced in February, Parekh joins an elite alumni association of state award-winners in 12 sports, including Lukas Verzbicas (2010-11 & 2009-10, Carl Sandburg High School, Orland Park, Ill.), Megan Goethals (2009-10, Rochester High School, Rochester Hills, Mich.), Jordan Hasay (2008-09, Mission College Preparatory Catholic High School, San Luis Obispo, Calif.) and Chris Derrick (2007-08, Neuqua Valley High School, Naperville, Ill.).

The 5-foot-6 senior raced to the Class 2A individual state championship this past season with a time of 16:23.9. The state's returning Gatorade Player of the Year in girls cross country, Parekh also won the Regional championship, the Sectional championship, the Richard Spring Invitational, the Hornet/Red Devil Invitational and the Naperville Twilight Invitational. She took ninth at the national Garmin RunningLane Cross Country Championships to earn All-American honors, and placed 18th at the national Eastbay Cross Country Championships.

Parekh has volunteered locally on behalf of youth track programs, a food pantry and a homeless shelter. "Ava continues to train hard, run fast and be a great teammate," said Latin School coach Dan Daly. "I've been privileged to see firsthand her growth and maturity as an athlete and as a person of high character."

Parekh has maintained an A average in the classroom. She has signed a National Letter of Intent to run on scholarship at Stanford University this fall.

The <u>Gatorade Player of the Year</u> program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which leverages experts including coaches, scouts, media and others as sources to help evaluate and determine the state winners in each sport.

Two-time winner Parekh joins recent Gatorade Illinois Girls Cross Country Player of the Year Katelynne Hart (2019-20, 2018-10, & 2017-18, Glenbard West High School), among the state's list of former award winners.

Gatorade has a long-standing history of serving athlete communities and understands how sports instill valuable lifelong skills on and off the field. Through Gatorade's "Play it Forward" platform, Parekh has the opportunity to award a \$1,000 grant to a local or national organization of their choosing that helps young athletes realize the benefits of playing sports. Parekh is also eligible to submit a short video explaining why the organization they chose is deserving of one of twelve \$10,000 spotlight grants, which will be announced throughout the year. To date, Gatorade Player of the Year winners' grants have totaled more than \$3.5 million across more than 1,300 organizations.

Since the program's inception in 1985, Gatorade Player of the Year award recipients have won hundreds of professional and college championships, and many have also turned into pillars in their communities, becoming coaches, business owners and educators.
