

**ANCHORAGE CHRISTIAN SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED
GATORADE ALASKA GIRLS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR**

CHICAGO (March 9, 2022) — In its 37th year of honoring the nation’s best high school athletes, Gatorade today announced **Sayvia Sellers** of **Anchorage Christian School** is the **2021-22 Gatorade Alaska Girls Basketball Player of the Year**. Sellers is the second Gatorade Alaska Girls Basketball Player of the Year to be chosen from Anchorage Christian School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the court, distinguishes Sellers as Alaska’s best high school girls basketball player. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Girls Basketball Player of the Year award to be announced in March, Sellers joins an elite alumni association of state award-winners in 12 sports, including Skylar Diggins-Smith (2008-09, Washington High School, Ind.), Nneka Ogumike (2007-08, CyFair High School, Texas), Maya Moore (2006-07, Collins Hill High School, Ga.), Candace Parker (2002-03 & 2003-04, Naperville Central High School, Ill.), and Lisa Leslie (1989-90, Morningside High School, Calif.).

The 5-foot-7 junior guard had led the Lions to a 14-3 record at the time of her selection. Sellers averaged 24.0 points, 6.1 assists, 4.6 rebounds and 4.5 steals per game. A First Team All-State honoree, she was also named to the All-Tournament Team at the Nike Tournament of Champions.

Sellers has volunteered locally on behalf of the Special Olympics and youth basketball programs. “Sayvia Sellers is one of the toughest players we faced all season,” said Martin Woods, head coach at Centennial High School (Calif.). “She’s very savvy, very skilled and she just doesn’t stop coming at you.”

Sellers has maintained a B average in the classroom. She will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The [Gatorade Player of the Year](#) program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which leverages experts including coaches, scouts, media and others as sources to help evaluate and determine the state winners in each sport.

Sellers joins recent Gatorade Alaska Girls Basketball Players of the Year Amelia 'Uhila (2020-21, Bartlett High School), Destiny Reimers (2019-20, Anchorage Christian School), and Alissa Pili (2018-19 & 2017-18, Dimond High School), among the state’s list of former award winners.

Gatorade has a long-standing history of serving athlete communities and understands how sports instill valuable lifelong skills on and off the court. Through Gatorade’s “Play it Forward” platform, Sellers has the opportunity to award a \$1,000 grant to a local or national organization of their choosing that helps young athletes realize the benefits of playing sports. Sellers is also eligible to submit a short video explaining why the organization they chose is deserving of one of twelve \$10,000 spotlight grants, which will be announced throughout the year. To date, Gatorade Player of the Year winners’ grants have totaled more than \$3.5 million across more than 1,300 organizations.

Since the program’s inception in 1985, Gatorade Player of the Year award recipients have won hundreds of professional and college championships, and many have also turned into pillars in their communities, becoming coaches, business owners and educators.
