ST. JOSEPH HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED GATORADE CONNECTICUT GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 23, 2023) — In its 38th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, Gatorade today announced **Alexa Pino** of **St. Joseph High School** is the **2022-23 Gatorade Connecticut Girls Soccer Player of the Year**. Pino is the sixth Gatorade Connecticut Girls Soccer Player of the Year to be chosen from **St. Joseph High School**.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the field, distinguishes Pino as Connecticut's best high school girls soccer player. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Girls Soccer Player of the Year award to be announced in June, Pino joins an elite alumni association of state award-winners in 12 sports, including Alyssa Thompson (2020-21, Harvard-Westlake School, Calif.), Mallory Swanson (2014-15, Mountain Vista High School, Colo.), Heather O'Reilly (2002-03 & 2001-02, East Brunswick High School, N.J.) and Abby Wambach (1997-98, Our Lady of Mercy School of Young Women, N.Y.).

The 5-foot-5 sophomore forward led the Cadets to a 21-1-1 record and the Class L state championship this past season. Pino scored 32 goals and passed for 17 assists, setting up a pair of goals in St. Joseph High School's 3-0 win over Notre Dame Catholic High School in the state final. A 2022 United Soccer Coaches All-American selection, Pino is a two-time First Team All-State honoree. She concluded her sophomore year with 58 goals and 28 assists in her prep soccer career.

Pino has volunteered locally as part of a fundraising campaign to benefit Al's Angels, an organization that provides support for families and children in need. She has also donated her time on behalf of her school's Unified Basketball program, which brings together athletes with and without intellectual challenges to train and compete on the same team. "Alexa is technically a strong player and very good in front of goal," said Rich Sutherland, head coach of Trumbull High School. She causes teams a lot of problems with her movement and her ability to link up with others and strike early at goal."

Pino has maintained a weighted A average in the classroom. She will begin her junior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which leverages experts including coaches, scouts, media and others as sources to help evaluate and determine the state winners in each sport.

Pino joins recent Gatorade Connecticut Girls Soccer Players of the Year Mary Lundregan (2021-22, St. Joseph High School), Maddie Fried (2020-21, St. Joseph High School), Chloe Landers (2019-20, Glastonbury High School), and Meadow Mancini (2018-19, Watertown High School), among the state's list of former award winners.
