SEABURY HALL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED GATORADE HAWAII BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (March 20, 2025)— In its 40th year of honoring the nation's most elite high school athletes, Gatorade today announced **Bromo Dorn** of **Seabury Hall** is the **2024-25 Gatorade Hawaii Boys Basketball Player of the Year**. Dorn is the first Gatorade Hawaii Boys Basketball Player of the Year to be chosen from Seabury Hall.

Gatorade Player of the Year is the top honor in high school sports, celebrating the nation's best high school athletes for their success on the court, in the classroom and in the community. The award distinguishes Dorn as Hawaii's best high school boys basketball player, and he joins an impressive group of alumni that spans CEOs, coaches and star athletes such as Karl-Anthony Towns (2012-13 & 2013-14, St. Joseph High School, N.J.), Jayson Tatum (2013-14, 2014-15 & 2015-16, Chaminade College Preparatory School, Mo.) and Cooper Flagg (2023-24, Montverde Academy, Fl.).

The 6-foot-6, 185-pound senior guard led the Spartans to a 29-4 and a Division II state title this past season, averaging 27.6 points, 5.3 rebounds, 2.9 steals and 2.1 assists en route to hitting 81 3-pointers. The 2024-25 MaxPreps Hawaii Player of the Year, Dorn scored 40 points or more in three separate games. He was named the Division II tournament's most outstanding player and is a two-time First Team All-State selection.

Dorn has volunteered locally as a youth basketball coach and instructor. "It sounds crazy to say, because he averaged 27 points a game, but Dorn is not just a scorer," said Robbie Shklov, head coach at Mid-Pacific High School. "He tries to get all his teammates involved. And that's even with Division II teams throwing three or four guys at him."

Dorn has maintained a 3.79 weighted GPA in the classroom. He remains undecided on his collegiate destination this fall.

The <u>Gatorade Player of the Year</u> program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states across 12 different high school sports – football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field – and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which leverages experts including coaches, scouts, media and others as sources to help evaluate and determine the state winners in each sport.

Dorn joins recent Gatorade Hawaii Boys Basketball Players of the Year Pupu Sepulona (2023-24 & 2022-23, Saint Louis School), Aiva Arquette (2021-22, Saint Louis School) and O'shen Cazimero (2020-21, Kohala High School), among the state's list of former award winners.

As part of Gatorade's commitment to breaking down barriers in sport, every Player of the Year also receives a grant to donate to a social impact partner. To date, the Gatorade Player of the Year program has provided more than \$5.6 million in grants to winners across more than 2,000 organizations.
