## ENSWORTH SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED GATORADE TENNESSEE BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

**CHICAGO** (June 12, 2025) — In its 40<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's most elite high school athletes, Gatorade today announced **Terrance Reynolds** of **Ensworth School** is the **2024-25 Gatorade Tennessee Boys Soccer Player of the Year**.

Gatorade Player of the Year is the top honor in high school sports, celebrating the nation's best high school athletes for their success on the field, in the classroom and in the community. The award distinguishes Reynolds as Tennessee's best high school boys soccer player, and he joins an impressive group of alumni that spans CEOs, coaches and star athletes such as Ben Bender (2019-20, Calvert Hall College High School, M.D.) and Ransford Gyan (2022-23 & 2023-24, St. Benedict's Preparatory School, N.J.).

The 6-foot-1, 180-pound junior midfielder scored 30 goals and passed for 11 assists this past season, leading the Tigers (12-1-1) to the Division II, Class AA state tournament semifinals. Reynolds recorded six hat tricks, including two games with four goals and one with five. He is ranked as the nation's No. 161 recruit in the Class of 2026 by TopDrawerSoccer.com.

Reynolds has volunteered locally with The Land Trust for Tennessee's Glen Leven Farm, and he has donated his time to the Special Olympics. "Terrance is a once-in-a-decade type player," said Christakis Agisilaou, head coach of Father Ryan High School. "He had a sense of calmness no matter the circumstance and his team fed off that, gamein and game-out. If you played Ensworth, he was the first thing on every scouting report."

Reynolds has maintained an A-minus average in the classroom. He has made a verbal commitment to play soccer at Georgetown University beginning in the fall of 2026.

The <u>Gatorade Player of the Year</u> program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states across 12 different high school sports – football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field – and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which leverages experts including coaches, scouts, media and others as sources to help evaluate and determine the state winners in each sport.

As part of Gatorade's commitment to breaking down barriers in sport, every Player of the Year also receives a grant to donate to a social impact partner. To date, the Gatorade Player of the Year program has provided more than \$5.6 million in grants to winners across more than 2,000 organizations.
